Now that you have received a lottery number, it is time to start thinking about your housing selection for Fall 2009. This guide will assist you in answering some of the questions you may have.

What are the chances the room I want will be available when I make my housing selection?

The number of 4-, 5-, 6-, and 8-person apartments are listed below per building. Spaces are selected in lottery number order and all spaces within the apartment may not be available when your number selects.

How was my lottery number assigned?

The numbers were assigned by class year with seniors getting the best numbers, following by juniors, then middlers, and finally sophomores. Approximately 6,000 students received lottery numbers for 2009-2010, making them eligible for housing.

Are there any singles available?

Many of the singles and studios are selected by seniors and juniors because they select first. The list below denotes a partial list of singles and studio apartments on campus.

What about Parcel 18?

Parcel 18 is our newest residence hall opening in the Fall 2009. Parcel 18 has a new type of living arrangement. Rooms are either singles or double occupancy and are connected to a similar room type by an internal bathroom. Configurations are: 2 singles, or 2 doubles connected by the shared bathroom that is accessed from within either room. Parcel 18 also requires a meal plan. All residents will be automatically billed for the 15 meal plan.
