A STUDENT SENATE RESOLUTION REGARDING THE ISSUE OF REQUIRED UNIFORMS FOR ATHLETIC TRAINING (A.T.) STUDENTS DURING PRACTICES.

WHEREAS A.T. students are required to accumulate 1000 certification hours with NU sport teams or with other affiliated school teams to graduate, and

WHEREAS A.T. students are assigned to a sport team during every quarter, and

WHEREAS Those hours are frequently accumulated during afternoons, evenings and weekends, minimizing part time working capacity, and

WHEREAS A.T. students have in the past been required by the A.T. staff, the Athletic Department, and the Bouve College to purchase uniforms to be worn at practices and games, and

WHEREAS SP-93-108 passed by the senate (but vetoed for its problematic language) clearly states that "That if the University chooses not to provide uniforms, then the A.T. students will not be required to be in a specific dress but will display professionalism by presenting themselves in clean, respectable fashion during those hours". Be It

RESOLVED That the University not require A.T. students to be in uniform except during games, and Be it Further

RESOLVED That students providing A.T. services, contributing to their 1000 certification hours, be required to only in professional dress. Professional dress is considered khaki pants, a clean dress shirt and a generally clean appearance.
