**WHEREAS:** Each college at Northeastern has a unique structure for its academic advising program, AND

**WHEREAS:** There are certain elements in each college's academic advising systems, regulations, and/or structures that are beneficial to its students' success, AND


**WHEREAS:** Some weaknesses exist in each college's academic advising systems, regulations, and/or structures that impede a student from achieving the level of academic success of which the student is capable, AND


**WHEREAS:** There currently is little cross-college communication on the academic advising systems, regulations, and/or structures that each college uses, and while recognizing that there are inherent differences in each college's structure that prevents uniform advising systems, regulations, and structures for the entire university, **THEREFORE**




