WHEREAS:		Northeastern University is an institution colnmitted to assisting its students in achieving academic excellence, AND		
WHEREAS:		emic achievement is that students be given a ime to ready themselves for final examinations,		
WHEREAS:	_	part of any faculty member to provide this guaranteed time the/she teaches at a significant academic disadvantage,		
WHEREAS:	The Northeastern University Faculty Senate has recently reaffirmed its university policy, which states that "No examination longer than one half-hour may be given during the seven days prior to the first day of final examination week," THERFORE IT IS THE SENSE OF THE STUDENT SENATE: That the Student Government Association of Northeastern University formally affirms the standing policy of the Faculty Senate which states that no examination of more than one half hour in length thay be given in the seven days prior to the first day of the final examination week to ensure that students fairly receive adequate time for exam preparation, AND IT IS FURTHER THE SENSE OF THE STUDENT SENATE:			
	That the Office of the Provost and the Deans of each respective college work vigorously to ensure that this policy is strictly enforced in all undergraduate academic settings.
