Executive Order

Subject: Structure Assessment Working Group

Over the past several years, there have been several attempts at a reconsideration of our current organizational structure. Due to the time constraints presented by an Executive Board and Parliamentarian that are replaced on an annual basis, these discussions have been largely discussions only and have rarely resulted in an action plan moving forward.

With this in mind, over the past 6 months, Parliamentarian Toczko and I have researched structures in place at other colleges and universities. The culmination of this research was discussed with the Senate during the Joint Senate held on November 16, 2009.

Given the recent discussions within Senate and among Senators since the initial discussions, **I hereby establish the Structure Assessment Working Group by Executive Order** to review the presented structure considerations. The working group, chaired by Parliamentarian Toczko, shall be open to all interested Senators.

The group will have the responsibility to review the presented structure modules and additional options proposed and to author a report which will:

- present advantages, disadvantages, and additional points of consideration for each of the options considered; and
- consider and document links between presented structure modules.

The report of the working group should be submitted to me and the Student Senate by Wednesday, January 6, 2010.

This date has been set in the interest of the timing of potential changes as they relate to the elections cycle for the 2010-11 elections.
